



THE ANTI-DOPING DIRECTOR

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OBLIGATIONS OF THE IDSF MEMBERS UNDER THE ANTI-DOPING RULES 2009

Under the regime of the IDSF Statutes and the IDSF Anti-Doping Code (**the Code**) and WADA's World Anti-Doping Code (**WADC**) the Members of IDSF have, among others, following obligations.

1. In return for membership in IDSF, Members agree to comply with the **WADC** and **the Code**, including requiring all athletes and support personnel within their jurisdiction to recognize and be bound by the **WADC** and **the Code**.
2. It's a condition of membership of IDSF that policies, rules and programs of the Members are in compliance with **the Code** and **the WADC**. In practice this means that each Member must ensure that own regulations (in compliance with **the Code** and the **WADC**) are in place and testing activities are performed in national or international competitions at Members' costs.
3. All IDSF Members are obliged to enforce **the Code** within their own jurisdiction, as part of the terms of their membership in IDSF.
4. IDSF Members do have the responsibility to cooperate with their National Anti-Doping Organization (NADO) and/or their National Olympic Committee (NOC).
5. Where funding is provided to athletes or others, IDSF Members have the duty to withhold some or all funding and support during any period of his or her period of ineligibility and to any athlete or athlete support personnel who has violated the anti-doping rules or otherwise are not compliant with **the Code**.
6. To vigorously pursue all potential anti-doping rule violations within its jurisdiction including investigation into whether athlete support personnel or other persons may have been involved in each case of doping.
7. Each IDSF Member must inform its registered (member) athlete's, dancers, trainers, adjudicators, officials and other athlete support personnel (including medical and para-medical personnel) about the requirements of **the Code**, by handing them out or make a available (website or otherwise) a copy of **the Code**, latest issue, and information and education about anti-doping policies and testing.
8. **The Code** applies to all participants (competitors) , adjudicators, organizers and athlete support personnel. It's a Members duty that all athletes, athlete support personnel, adjudicators, organizers of competitions and other officials within its organization, recognize en be bound by **the Code**. This means in practice that all mentioned persons are to be full member of the Members Federation and/or be bound by means of a contract (**Forms of Consent**, which is part of **the Code**). IDSF Members are the first responsible to ensure that afore mentioned persons and/or organs, are bound by the rules by means of the **Forms of Consent**.
9. Members must ensure to nominate to IDSF granted (sanctioned) DanceSport Championships, events and competitions only participants (participant means: all athletes and athlete support personnel, including coaches, trainers, managers, staff, adjudicators, etc) who have agreed in writing to comply with all of the duties set out in **the Code** and who have signed the **Forms of Consent**. As a consequence, participants to IDSF Championships and competitions must, prior to participation, agree to comply with **the Code** by signing the **Forms of Consent**./02



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10. Completed and signed **Forms of Consent** must be send by the IDSF Member or the participant (in any way, it's the responsibility of the Member) to the organizer together with the entry form for a competition. Organizers (Members) of IDSF competitions must refuse entrance of any competitor or adjudicator that has not completed and signed the **Forms of Consent**.
11. Members must ensure that the organizer of an IDSF competition within their country or jurisdiction, granted to or through that Member by IDSF, has recognized and is bound by the Code and that all the obligations for Organizers are adhered to.
12. IDSF Members must ensure that no athletes shall be allowed to compete in its national championships unless such athlete has accepted the Code and the Members' anti-doping rules.
13. Members must require from their athletes to provide whereabouts information and be available for out-of-competition testing (OOCT) when selected in the international or national OCCT pool (Registered Testing Pool) and Members must cooperate in any way with the officials organizing and performing testing.
14. Members must conduct and perform anti-doping controls in their national competitions and championships including result management and sanctioning offenders at their own expense. All results of such tests, including supporting documents, must be send to the IDSF Anti-Doping Director at once.
15. Members must provide annual information to IDSF about their anti-doping programs and testing and result management.
16. Members must authorize and facilitate independent observers from WADA and IDSF when requested.
17. Every Member shall inform the IDSF Anti-Doping Director of the results of Anti-Doping controls performed by that member, or other anti-doping authorities, in competitions organized or granted by that Member as well as of the measurements taken by that Member in the event of a possible rule violation. The same applies about doping controls carried out by others than IDSF or that Member, such as a National Anti-Doping Administration or Institution (NADO) and WADA.
